The Holy Week of Loving Forgiveness

Have you ever experienced a day when you felt a skip in your step, the world was not against you, everything aligned with smiles, and the dominoes of your day falling one after another all in your favor? Then an unannounced and unforeseen text, email, headline, phone call, insult or accident challenges you instantly to lose the smile and skip in your gifted day. Like in billiards, when the cue ball hits racked billiard balls, life's balance, beauty, and hope can scatter and shatter that quickly. Beginning today, Palm Sunday the first day of Holy Week, our liturgies through the week certainly have a sense of that.

Palm Sunday of Holy Week brings celebration and hope filled with hosannas of victory of the anointed Messiah coming into Jerusalem. The hope of Jesus entering Jerusalem is shattered with despair on Holy Thursday by his arrest and on Good Friday his trial, passion and death.

But hope over despair rises again upon Jesus' last breath Good Friday on the cross. At the moment of his death the Temple curtain, separating the Spirit of God in the Holy of Holies from His creation, was torn in two. God has torn apart any separation of Himself from us even with "the folly of the cross." We are loved by God, embraced by God, and forgiven by God. We are to live knowing Spirit and creation are no longer separated.

Holy Week is celebration then despair leading to the joy of Easter Sunday. We are to rejoice in our forgiveness to give us new hope and new life all out of God's love for His creation. In his book *Jesus of Nazareth: What He Wanted, Who He Was* Gerhard Lohfink writes the following about forgiveness:

"Easter, 1960. Dag Hammarskjold, the second Secretary General of the United Nations, wrote this: *"Forgiveness breaks the chain of causality because he who "forgives" you — out of love takes upon himself the consequences of what you have done. Forgiveness, therefore always entails a sacrifice."*

Holy Week is the week leading to God's forgiveness. This week maybe we need to ask ourselves who do we need to forgive, through our sacrifice out of love, to heal hurt and separation?

The Sacraments

The seven sacraments are essential to the Catholic way of life. They are marvelous gifts from God and might be described as blessed grace-filled moments along our earthly journey. Each sacrament is an encounter with the risen Jesus. Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist are called the Sacraments of Christian Initiation because they incorporate us into the saving death and resurrection of Jesus (the "Paschal Mystery"). Baptism and Confirmation are not repeatable because they give us an "indelible mark" as a member of the Body of Christ. Eucharist, the high point of our initiation, can be received every day, but at least once a week on Sunday. The Eucharist ("Holy Communion") nourishes us and strengthens us to live as disciples of Jesus. Holy Communion is also a sign of unity with Jesus and with each other. 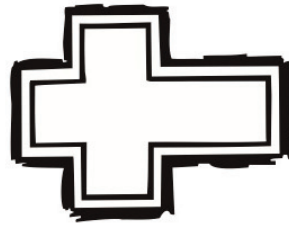

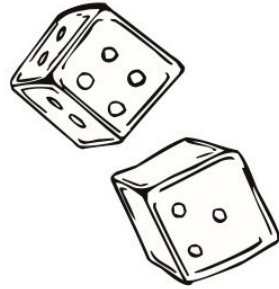
