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Solitude

While stay at home orders, and general discomfort with the direction of the pandemic has forced many people to sequester themselves away, quietly in their homes, to stay well, that has **not** been true for me. My own life has carried on, though in different forms than usual. Daily and weekend Masses are happening outside or by livestream. My counselling appointments and marriage preparations are either by Zoom or in the courtyard, with facemasks, rather than comfortably in my office, but it works fairly well. Wedding and funerals have continued; visits to the sick, so long as they are home, have also carried on. Deacon Neil has been working on repairing everything in the parish plant, and Gaby has worked so very hard to provide an increasingly professional livestreamed liturgy on Sundays, each requiring planning with me. I feel that my time has been well spent, but it is time for a small break.

With some frequency, Jesus would go off to quiet places to pray, in each of the Gospels, but especially in the Gospel of Luke (4:42; 5:16; 6:12; 9:18, 28; 11:1 22:41). What is good for Jesus is good for me, too. So when you get a chance to read this I will be away for retreat at the House of Prayer for Priests, down by Griffith Park, and taking a few days for my post-Christmas break. It's a little late, but it's when I could accomplish it. I promise to stay safe – as my retreat will be private, rather than in a group, I will be quite safe. I do get a few additional days of downtime, which will most likely be long hikes in quiet places. Ever since my time on the *Camino* I have felt drawn to taking some time in prayerful conversation with God on long walks. It has been a blessing for me.

I encourage you, too, to look seriously at the time you have been spending alone. I invite you to consider the difference between loneliness and solitude. The former is often painful, filled with longing and a sense of incompletion. The latter, solitude, though, is anything but that, springing from either a place of contentment and wellbeing, or desire for growth and transformation.

When our hearts are full of gratitude, when our body is well or when our relationships are in order, spending time to contemplate the goodness of our lives and the gratitude we have for God can be a total grace. When we have reason for discontent, not with others, but with our own actions or history, with unsettled issues from the past or important questions about the future, time alone with the Lord can be an opportunity for astounding growth.

In either case, it is possible for us, even the extroverts among us, to profit from time spent alone with just the Lord in attendance with us in our thoughts. To do this right though may require us to consider how to set things up correctly. For example, a comfortable chair might seem the perfect place for reflection ... but only if you don't fall immediately asleep, signaling that maybe one of our needs might be better sleep patterns. It's one of the reasons I prefer to walk while I reflect. Our own homes or offices, with all of the competing tasks, and the calls of others for our attention, might be hostile to deep reflection. Retreat centers, parks and the coast are excellent places for reflective time. Some people reflect better with music, while others find music distracting. Knowing what takes you inward, and silences the distractions may take some practice.

I encourage you to be deliberate about taking some regular and even frequent time for solitude, in the Holy Presence of God. It will mean that your life can be intentional, rather than undirected. It will enable you to dwell on your many reasons for gratitude. Perhaps most importantly of all, the Lord desires an intimacy with us that only time alone, together, can provide.

Know that I will be praying for you on retreat, as I do, in fact do every day.


