Rejoice in the Good News

Dear friends on the journey,

Here we are at the fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as the Laetare Sunday, which comes from the Latin *laetor*, meaning to rejoice, to be joyful. What do we have to rejoice today? Being two thirds of the way through Lent? Being a week away from spring and longer days? Being that much closer to Easter? Being closer to the majority vaccinated? Seeing the light at the end of this long tunnel of pandemic? Yes, to all the above! However, today's readings give us something even better to rejoice and celebrate...God's love for each of us.

In today's gospel, we hear probably the most famous and quoted lines in scripture: John 3:16 "For God so love the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." This is amazing news, right? Our God love us so much and he is so generous that he sent his Son to save us. This love is unconditional, but (there's always a but) on the other side of this same coin is our response, our choice to accept this gift.

To be saved is to accept this gift and believe in Jesus. But what are we being saved from exactly? As John describes, it means escaping darkness and coming fully into the light of salvation and living with God. To fully rejoice in this light requires an understanding of the darkness. The darkness is the sinful state of the world, where we live in unbelief and distrust in God. Our tendency to sin is a direct result of original sin when Adam and Eve, first man and woman, disobeyed and distrusted God by taking things into their own hands. Because of this, humanity is predisposed to the same distrust and rebelliousness. The first reading in 2 Chronicles describes the fall of Judah, when the priests and people deny God's compassion and the subsequent destruction. So much of the Old Testament is God's persistent pursuit of the chosen people who time and time again try to do things their own way. Today, for us, the darkness is not much different as we hunker into self-absorption, self-reliance, greed, anger, stubbornness, pride, control, doubt, self-righteousness and so on.

The good news is that we do not have to stay in the darkness. The light is always there for us. We just must be willing to let go of the comfort of darkness and step into embracing our identity as children of God, surrendering control to God, trusting in God's guidance, and leaning into God's mercy. The other good news is that, as we step back into darkness at times in our lives, God is waiting patiently with open arms. There in the middle, the bridge from darkness to the light, is Jesus who is the way, the truth and the life. He is our teacher in word and deed. He is the sacrifice so that we can live in light. How can we not rejoice in that Good News!



Lent is an important time for the Elect who are in their final period of preparation for initiation into the Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and first reception of Eucharist. On the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent, they will celebrate three important rites called scrutinies. The purpose of the scrutinies is to uncover and then heal whatever is weak and sinful in the Elect ... and in us, as we pray together. The scrutinies also are meant to bring out and strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. (RCIA #141) By celebrating these rites with the parish community on three successive Sundays, the Elect reflect ever more deeply on the mystery of sin and the power of Christ to overcome sin. Please continue to pray for our Elect as they draw nearer to the sacraments.




