
Patrick Saint-Jean, S.J. Thursday, August 12, 7:00 pm, via Zoom


Faithful and true is the word of our God. All of God's works are so worthy of trust. God's mercy falls on the just and the right; full of God's love is the earth.

The Bread of Life

Dear friends on the journey,

I've always been taken with the line in the Lord's Prayer, "give us this day our daily bread." In my Synoptic Gospels class at St. John's Seminary, an exegesis paper was the ideal opportunity to dive into this particular line in scripture from Matthew 6:11. This project was a critical explanation or interpretation of the text and to do so required much research of other scripture passages and commentaries, including Proverbs 30:8 that says "give me neither poverty nor riches; provide me only with the food I need" and today's first reading from Exodus.

The Israelites have followed Moses into the desert and are once again grumbling and worrying about food and comfort. But once again God makes a promise, the promise of a daily portion of meat and manna. However, they are instructed to only collect their daily portion, no more and no less. God's instruction is a test. Do they trust God enough to rely on his daily provision of food?

For the Israelites the manna from heaven was for their physical nourishment but in today's gospel from John, Jesus describes another type of bread from heaven. He instructs his disciples not to seek "food that perishes" but rather "for the food that endures for eternal life." Jesus is describing himself as the new bread of life for the disciples then and for us today. This new bread is our spiritual nourishment, food that never leaves us hungry or thirsty. By receiving this bread of life we are entering into and accepting a friendship with Jesus, through whom we our "nourished, fed, strengthened and become more alive."

Sometimes we can be like the grumbling Israelites. So today is a good time to reflect on our attitude and orientation. Are we grumbling? Do we turn to perishable material things that might taste better or feel better? Do we gather up more than we need for fear of later poverty or can we be content with just the daily necessities? Do we trust that God will provide all that we need, physically and spiritually, exactly when we need it? Are we willing to sacrifice secular or popular ways and our own ego to follow Jesus? Do we really trust this new bread of life is enough?

During the exegesis project, I couldn't help but reflect personally on the ways God had always provided for me each day so whenever I pray the words "give us this day our daily bread" I intentionally renew my trust in God to always provide and when I receive the Eucharist, I renew my faith that Jesus will always be the nourishment I need. Today, as we pray the Our Father and receive the Eucharist, may we orient ourselves towards God, towards contentment, towards recognizing God's abundant blessings in our lives, towards sharing that goodness with others, and towards a life nourished by the Jesus, the Bread of Life.
