# Taste and See the Goodness of the Lord

Dear friends on the journey,

Today's first reading from 1 Kings reminds me of a familiar experience. God's prophet Elijah killed the prophets of Baal. In retaliation Jezebel threatened Elijah's life so he fled and embarked on a forty-day journey, following in the footsteps of Moses, to the mountains to encounter God. In scripture, many humans met God face to face on a mountaintop – Abraham, Moses, Jesus.

How on earth is this a familiar experience, you ask? Unlike Elijah, I have not literally had to escape death, but certainly have needed to get away from the stresses of life. On Elijah's journey in the desert, he came upon a tree where he stopped to sleep, eat, drink and rest. Then strengthened by the experience, Elijah was able to walk forty days and forty nights to the mountaintop.

Summer is a natural time to take a break. Families with children get a break from school. The warmer weather calls us to enjoy the outdoors. Even in parish life some ministries pause during the summer and a slower pace gives staff and leaders time to rest and plan. But no matter the season really, we all need a break from the routine. We all need a pause to rest and renew our body, mind and soul.

As I write this I am preparing for a week away at our family's beach house in Cayucos, a very much needed change of scenery and pace. My family of three is joining my sister's family of five and my cousin's family of four to enjoy each other's company, sleep a little later, play games, swim, visit wineries to drink of the harvest, eat good food, and simply just rest. In general, I look forward to tasting and seeing the goodness of the Lord as today's responsorial psalm reminds.

I picture our life like a journey on the highway where, every now and then, we stop at the rest stop to stretch our legs, nap, and grab a snack. It is in this type of resting and pausing that we can look back and celebrate where we've come from and be recharged for the next leg of the trip. God created rest when he created the world. On the seventh day, God rested. Later God made it a commandment and not a law for the sake of it but because God knows we need rest. So why not take advantage!

These rest stops are essential to our body and mind as Jesus is for our soul, our spiritual life. Every Mass Jesus nourishes us in the Eucharist. In these last weeks of summer, I encourage you to find a tree or mountain like Elijah, even just a day or weekend. Start with Mass then enjoy good rest, food, and drink, and taste and see the goodness of our Lord.


