Subtle and Brilliant

My Dear Parish Family,

I went to Trader Joe's yesterday. I was standing in front of the cheese case with my back to my cart, when I turned around one of my grocery bags was gone! Who does that? In Trader Joe's in Camarillo?? Unthinkable. And yet, I thought about it a lot yesterday and today too. When I was in the checkout line with my one remaining bag ... I mentioned to the checker what had happened and she too reacted the same way I did, "who does that?" We went on to have a nice conversation about museums and anniversaries and as I left, wishing her well, I noticed the woman in line right behind me with my bag. Then ensued the mental tug of war. Do I say something or let it go? I did not say anything.

I thought, gosh if you needed a bag that badly I would have gladly given you one. Geeze is a grocery bag worth going to hell? (Of course that is not for me to say, but I thought it for a split second.) In light of today's Gospel from Matthew chapter 5:13-16, I am struggling with how I could have helped to bring that lady closer to Jesus. Has my salt gone flat? I pray that next time I will say something like, "dear one, I see that bag, is there anything else you need?" Or even, simply quietly pay for her groceries.

If salt loses its taste, what good is it? If a light is too dim to light a space, what good is it? Similarly, if followers of Jesus simply go through the motions of following Jesus - going to mass and minding our own business - without helping others grow closer to him, are we doing our job? This Gospel invites us to assess our saltiness, our wattage, our potency as Christians. How Christian of a Christian am I? Do the things I spend time on bring me closer to Jesus; do they add value to my life and enrich the lives of those around me? Do I strive with some regularity to grow in my spiritual practices, my prayer life, my volunteer activities? Am I continuing to evolve into the best 'me' that I can be?

Jesus gives us two methods today, one subtle and one brilliant. A subtle option for introverts maybe or when subtle is best. To be salt in just the right proportion, unnoticeable, not too light, not too heavy. Additionally, a brilliant option for extroverts or for those situations when our good example alone may not be enough to extend that invitation to know Jesus. To be a light, letting the light of Jesus shine through us, a spotlight, a search light, for others to see and find their way.

Despite feeling aggravated and violated, I care about the bag lady. I hope she overheard me telling the checker about the bag. I hope she noticed that I did not say anything unkind. I pray that every time she uses the bag that she has a good day and is touched by the salt and light that surrounds her.

God's grace is working in all of us all the time. We can be "thoroughly decent people" (Wikipedia's definition for 'salt the of earth'). We can let the light of Jesus shine through us, for others. We can be in right relationship with our families and neighbors. We can help. We can serve. We can care. We can put others first. We have the capacity for such living. We have the capacity for such loving. Assess your potency. Rediscover, and reinvigorate if needed, your salt and light. Engage with Jesus. Give church more time. Rest, listen, share, be.
