1. Mentions of Joseph in the Scriptures

- o New Testament:
 - Matthew our primary focus
 - Luke appears occasionally
 - John is named, but never appears in the text
 - Mark never mentioned!

2. Beginning with begats: Joseph's genealogy

- Joseph's Genealogy: Matt 1:1-17
 - Jesus Christ / Abraham / David
- Missing: "Joseph the father of Jesus"
- o Roman adoptions: constitutive
 - constitutionally part of a new house
 - all about inheritance...of a lineage
 - God's agreement: Luke 1:31-32
 - See also Rom 1:3 and 2 Time 2:8

3. Joseph's interesting ancestors

- o "Colorful women"
 - Tamar Gen 1:3
 - Rahab 1:5
 - Ruth 1:5
 - Bathsheba 1:6
- An appropriate time
 - 3 sets of 14 generations
- o Only 2 titles
 - King David and Jesus the Messiah

4. For our consideration

o Beyond what you do, does the person you are serve God?

5. Rare scriptural descriptions of goodness

- o Righteous men who act
 - Joseph Matt 1:19
 - Joseph of Arimathea Luke 23:50
 - Barnabas/Joseph Acts 11:21

6. A dilemma for Joseph – Matt 1:18-22

- Stoning pregnant women
 - Deut 22:20-21
 - A quiet divorce
 - Mishnah Gittin 9:10 and spoiling the soup

7. **Dreaming Josephs**

- o Dreams of Joseph, son of Jacob
 - Gen 37:5-11
 - Going to Egypt and saving the people
- Angelic encouragements
 - "Do not fear" / "Name him..."
- Immediate compliance
- o Having no relations:
 - Meaning only Mary was a virgin

8. For our spiritual consideration

- o Would angels be inviting you not to fear?
 - Are we confident?
 - Do we live in doubt?
- o Are we, like Joseph, in obedience to God, willing to be utterly overturned?
- O Are there "Mary's," who look like problems but end up being blessings, in our lives?

9. The visit of the Magi

- o Matt 2:1-12
- Not Luke's version:
 - No stable
 - No inn
 - No manger
 - No tax
 - No trip from Nazareth
- o In Joseph's *home*?
 - See Matt 2

10. Flight to Egypt

- o Matt 2:13-15
 - Herod the Horrible
- Commands this time
 - and again, quiet compliance;
 - a model of willingness to put life completely on hold;
- An example we can follow?
 - Do we wrap our lives around our God, our Jesus?

11. A selfless good man, dreaming of home

- o Matt 2:15, 19-23
- o Josephs, dreams, Egypt and saviors
- o Evidence from Josephus:
 - Herod's dead is 4 BC
- o No year "0," and "1" is wrong
 - Dionysius Exiguus
- Joseph avoids Archelaus
 - does not go home to Bethlehem
 - Matthew and Luke differ

12. Things to notice...

- o We see Matthew's infancy narrative (chs. 1 &2) through Joseph's eyes.
- Never speaks...ever.
 - ...and then disappears.
- o It's all about Jesus. He was all about Jesus.

13. After he's gone

- o Matt 13:54-58
 - The implication:
 - Joseph has already died
- o Brothers?
 - Who are James, Joseph, Simon, Judas and his sisters?
- o Protevangelium of James
 - An older man?
 - Step brothers and sisters?

14. Joseph the Carpenter

- O How we know Joseph was a carpenter:
 - "carpenter, wood-worker, builder"
 - tevktwn / tektōn
 - See also Mark 6:3, Matt 13:55 and Luke 4:22
- A choice with a message:
 - from the only father chosen, before birth, by the step-son.
 - Evaluating those who labor in our lives.

15. Joseph in Luke

- o Luke 1:26-28
 - Also an infancy narrative
 - Mary's perspective...not Joseph's
 - "betrothed" implying "newly married"
- O David's city?
 - Jerusalem / Bethlehem
 - Malachi 5:1
- o Joseph is a law abiding citizen
- O Despite differences between MT and LK:
 - Jesus is born in Bethlehem and raised in Nazareth

16. Luke's genealogy

- Working in the opposite direction from Matthew's genealogy:
 - from Jesus, "the son, as was thought, of Joseph..."
 - to Adam
 - The *same* point as Matthew
- o Includes the Gentiles (us)

17. Presentation in the Temple

- o Luke 2:22-40
- o Again, Joseph is an observant, law abiding Jew
- An offering of the poor Lev 12:6-8
- o Growing strong and wise with Joseph

18. Jesus as a boy in the Temple

- o Luke 2:42-51
- o A short childhood / an early manhood
- o Bar Mitzvahs at....13!
- o "child," not "young man"
- o Confusing fathers!
 - and a silent Joseph
- o "obedient" or "subject to them"
- An adolescent with good intentions
