Happy New Year, friends!

We've all had a microwave meal at some time in our life. Upon their introduction to the world, I'm sure families, particularly moms, were grateful to deliver a hot meal to the table in a fraction of time. Its novelty must have been a relief from the grind of planning, preparing, serving and cleaning up a well-balanced nutritious dinner day after day. But are they really the best for us? While microwavable meals are convenient and ready in two steps, they certainly have very little nutritional value and don't allow for creative culinary skills. A real home-cooked meal takes some thought, energy, time but is generally healthier and even allows opportunities for everyone to get involved.

The same can be said about our spirituality and relationship with God. In our busyness and distracted living, a microwaved opportunity or encounter can certainly be the shot in the arm we need at the moment but it remains on the surface. It doesn't allow for a deeper connection that fosters an ongoing conversion to a true life of discipleship and often times just leaves us hungry.

In today's gospel, John the Baptist reminds us that Jesus is the Lamb of God, the sacrifice and the baptizer. John baptizes with water but Jesus baptizes with the Holy Spirit. Baptism is more than a ritual event. The very definition of a sacrament is "an outward sign of an inward reality." This reality we do not fully understand and takes a lifetime to grasp. The moment we received the water and the spirit we're not done and ready to serve in three minutes. We enter a lifelong journey of coming to know Jesus and growing in relationship with God. Our journey is that home-cooked meal. Our spirituality and relationship with God takes time, preparation, sacrifice and patience. We learn cooking basics and techniques, follow a recipe or combine a couple, clean the kitchen, and gather the necessary ingredients and utensils, pots and pans. We monitor our progress and we taste it along the way. Sometimes, when it's not the desired flavor, we start again. It's a process to practice over and over again until we reach the desired outcome.

John the Baptist's role was simply to point to Jesus. Our lives too are to point to Jesus. Living out our baptism as Jesus' disciples should always point the way. At least that's our goal. Sometimes we have to evaluate and recommit ourselves over and over again. If you were to stop right this minute and look at your life, how does it point to God? How would a stranger know you are a Christian? What do you need to change?

So during this new year, I challenge you to seriously examine your relationship with God. What do we want it to look like in a year? Do you want a superficial microwaved experience? Or are you willing to commit yourself to that deeper, healthier connection? Are you willing to put in the time and resources to learn,

practice and grow in the relationship God wants with you so much so that it's obvious to others who will then want what you have? I promise it will taste better than you can possibly imagine.



Read Between the Lines

When children express that something is wrong at school, read between the lines to determine what is really going on. They might say "I'm bored" and need guidance to find more challenging academic work. Ask them to give examples to help you understand what is going on. If the child is still being vague, remind them that they can tell you anything and that you will listen with an open mind. As parents and caregivers, we can help kids deal with negative feelings and challenges. If they are being mistreated in some way, keeping an open line of communication will enable you to be their advocate. 




